1. INTRODUCTION

This Scientific Report aims to present the activity developed at the research unit DINAMIA'CET-Iscte (DC-Iscte), Centre for the Study of Socioeconomic Change and the Territory, during 2021.

Despite the instability associated with the pandemic crisis, which continued throughout 2021, the year was essentially marked by a return to normality of research activity, with the necessary adaptations to a reality that has inevitably changed. Even though in the most severe periods of the health crisis in 2021 a new total lockdown occurred, research activity went on, adapted to this new situation, and drawing upon the experience of the previous year. The use of teleworking (including remote participation in day-to-day meetings, but also in international project meetings, conferences and other academic events) was expanded, as well as the development of creative solutions to overcome methodological difficulties experienced in the pursuance of research activities. Once again, the technological support and the advantages of digital contacts have helped to overcome some of the difficulties and to reduce the impact of the lockdowns and other pandemic-related contingencies to the academic activity and to the advancement of some research work. Parallel to this, other solutions were implemented in order to facilitate material and financial execution of the projects and to ensure efficiency and safety in face-to-face activities, which have been progressively advancing in a natural way.

This “return to normality” is well expressed in the activity of the Unit’s researchers, with a significant increase in publications during this year (resuming the upward trajectory of recent years), and with a strong dynamism with regard to new research contracts achieved (including hosting an ERC Grant – the first at DC as well as at Iscte) and to the number of proposals submitted by Dinamia'CET-Iscte researchers, collectively and individually, during 2021. The number of paper presentations in scientific events, along with dissemination activities to broader audiences, also strongly recovered during this year, involving both the presence in face-to-face events and the adaptation to the new range of online events.

A particular event was pivotal in DC's activity this year: the DC-Iscte commemorative conference “Entre Transições: Retrospetivas – Transversalidades – Perspetivas”, held in June 2021 at ISCTE. This DINÂMIA and CET Anniversary Conference, designed in articulation with the Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL) work, had been planned for 2020 and was postponed to 2021 so that participants could gather in person. It was a fundamental moment for academic exchange, reconnection and knowledge dissemination within the DC community, as well as for external affirmation and visibility of the research unit. A book is being produced in the aftermath of this event, to be launched in 2022.

Many other events and activities planned under the Research Groups (RG) regular activity and respective thematic lines and research projects (conferences, workshops, seminars, etc.) were held during this year contributing to the return to

a certain normality in terms of the Unit's scientific activity (some of which had been postponed or revised according to the contingencies). These included the organization of some medium-large international conferences (e.g., the International Conference Grand Projects - Urban Legacies of the late 20th Century, held online in February 2021, the Conference Optimistic Suburbia 2: Middle-class large housing complexes, held online in June 2021, or the co-organization of the II International Conference of the network "Todas as artes, Todos os nomes", held in Porto in hybrid format in July 2021) as well as the collaboration in the organization of many other scientific events at international, national and regional scales.

An issue of outstanding relevance, considering the strategic plan of the unit, was the public launch of the Observatório do Emprego Jovem (Youth Labour Observatory) of DC-Iscte, in October 2021, after its postponement in 2020. Equally noteworthy was the public launch, in November, of LXHabidata, the open data platform on housing and related issues for the Lisbon metropolitan area. One of the goals underpinning this platform is the construction of an observatory dedicated to housing. Although these research structures were already underway beforehand, their public launch marked a new stage, providing useful and quality information produced by DC-Iscte research teams to various target audiences.

In addition to ensuring the continuity of the articulation of research carried out at DC-Iscte with the master's and doctoral programs associated with it (including thematic seminars under the Doctoral Programme in Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories, resulting at an annual conference at CIUL, or the "Jornadas dos Estudos Urbanos" annual event), the consolidation and affirmation of the programs (MA and PhD) in Political Economy deserves to be highlighted. The huge success of the first editions of these programmes was accompanied by the co-organization of several seminar cycles on political economy in the scope of DC-Iscte activities. This nurturing of the relation between PhD programmes and DC research activity has been also driven by quite interesting results in the individual funding call for tenders (particularly FCT scholarships) in recent years, with several projects of DC-Iscte researchers funded, in Architecture, Urban studies and Political Economy programs.

In 2021, DC-Iscte activity encompassed more than 40 collective research projects (38 of those funded, dedicating a budget of over 1.3 million euros to these activities in this year), as well as the individual direct funding of 32 full time researchers (11 with PhD, and 21 with no PhD), in addition to all those who are contracted in the framework of research projects. In the scope of the strategic plan, a call for 2 new research positions was launched, fundamental for the dynamization of the articulation between research groups, the Unit's board and the Unit's technical staff, namely in the areas of information management (assuring the achievement and monitoring of better information about DC-Iscte activities and its researchers works) and of articulation and mobilization of research teams (and pre-award organization for project submissions) across the different research groups and stabilized teams.

This has allowed an increase to the team that, despite some oscillations and natural inward and outward movements, has been growing consistently and sustainably, over the most recent years (at the end of 2021 there were 113 integrated researchers with PhD (in addition to 105 non-PhD integrated researchers and 25 collaborators). This growth, unlike a few years ago, is now more balanced among research groups, not concentrated in the Cities and Territories RG anymore, but extending to all 3 research groups. The DC community comprises now more than 240 researchers, involved in a diversity of research activities and collective and individual projects.

This consistent growth has enabled, during recent years, a steady collective effort made by DC-Iscte researchers to respond to various calls for submitting applications for funding through research projects, both national and internationally, in line with the operational mid-term objectives. This occurred again in 2021, with 50 proposals submitted to a variety of funding opportunities (at European level, FCT call in all scientific domains, and collective proposals to calls from other entities, including invitations from public ones), and 15 new projects approved for DC-Iscte research teams, notwithstanding the significant decrease in approval rates, especially with FCT funding.

It is also important to acknowledge the effort made by the Unit researchers to increase publication ratios, as well as the growing visibility that some are achieving through other means of communication and research dissemination, such as traditional (newspapers, radio and television) and social media, extending the social impacts of their work to other audiences. While the publication system in scientific journals has become particularly competitive and seems to be progressively inequitable (based on highly debatable criteria and funding mechanisms), it is still not very permeable to non-academic audiences, so it is essential to reach these audiences through other complementary means. Some links between academia and civil society have been strengthened, not only in terms of scientific production dissemination, but also in their involvement as partners in research projects at DC-Iscte.

In organizational terms, it is important to refer an important drawback during 2021. With the exit of one of the members of the technical staff (Rui Raimundo, at the middle of the year, after one year at DC-Iscte, as he was offered better conditions for working at another research unit), DC is struggling again below its full capacity –and full needs – regarding technical staff. The long-awaited hiring of a 6th technical staff member for the Unit, that had been finally achieved in 2020, resulted in a new hiring process which was launched and operationalized during 2021, and is still waiting for Iscte central adjustments to be concluded. This was one of the operational mid-term objectives contemplated in the unit's Strategic Plan 2018-2022 that took a long time to achieve, and that is now jeopardized again. This raises the need to question and discuss the criteria and the conditions made possible by Iscte to allow these contracts. These conditions are indeed incapable to attract and retain quality human resources in the field of science management, as it is has been recurrently demonstrated by hiring processes held in the various research units of

ISCTE in recent years (often inconsequent due to the lack of quality of its applicants or by their short-term commitment to their activity, considering the low wages offered, among other aspects), which is an issue that should be taken seriously by ISCTE governing bodies.

Regardless (and also because of) this situation, it is also fair to mention here the effort made by all the Unit's technical staff in terms of the support provided, remotely and in person, in a prompt manner, to all researchers and to the DC-Iscte's management bodies, as well as to Iscte's central services, under the difficult conditions that affected the Unit's operation again in 2021. This mobilization was a big challenge and absolutely essential to ensure not only support to research project applications but also the smooth running of the Unit.

A final note is due to refer the institutional compromise that DC-Iscte assumed in integrating the diverse projects launched by the rectorate of Iscte in the field of research, including the integration of the consortium of Research Units of Iscte that applied for (and get the status of) an Associate Laboratory (SOCIODIGITALAB – Iscte - Sociodigital Lab for Public Policies), as well as the participation in the CVTT consortium (CVTT-Iscte - Associação Iscte Conhecimento e Inovação - Centro de Valorização e Transferência de Tecnologias). Even though this was not foreseen in the Unit's Strategic Plan, DC-Iscte did not fail to respond to these new challenges and participated in both projects, committed to the development of collaboration among ISCTE research units and with the principles of interdisciplinarity research and social useful applied science that are already part of its own "genetic code".

2. DINAMIA'CET-Iscte scientific identity and organization

2.1. DINÂMIA'CET-Iscte and its Scientific Identity¹

DINÂMIA'CET – Iscte (DC-Iscte), Centre for the Study of Socioeconomic Change and Territory, is an Iscte interdisciplinary research unit in social and human sciences which combines fundamental and applied research on relevant economic, social and cultural topics.

We perform advanced international and comparative research, framed by a sustainable development approach, while pledging to increase knowledge about dynamics and changes of Portuguese society.

We seek to contribute to the understanding of the contemporary world and to the design of the future through the analysis of contexts, actors and consequences of change, encompassing a particular focus on public policy and institutional frameworks, on an analytical and a normative level.

DC-Iscte mobilizes an array of theoretical and methodological resources guided by a common core issue. What is at stake is to capture the nature of the dynamics underlying socioeconomic and territorial change, their genesis in the inter-play between collective public and private actors operating in different domains (e.g. markets, territorial communities, public spaces), as well as their impact, notably in spatial terms (landscape, morphology, etc.).

Researchers at DC-Iscte pay particular attention to individual action (choices, expectations, creative insights, emotions, etc.) and to institutional endeavours stemming from states as well as sub-, inter- and supranational bodies to moderate, boost or restrain this action.

Research focused on the evaluation of the consequences of such institutional regulation is also based on a reflexive analysis of our own domain of activity - scientific research, its relationships with its context and the changes it goes through, in line with DC-Iscte's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers.

2.2. Organization and activities²

DINÂMIA'CET-Iscte gathers researchers from a wide range of academic backgrounds (economics, sociology, law, architecture, regional and urban planning, anthropology, geography, management, quantitative methods, etc.). It is organized in three research groups (RG):


- (i) Innovation and Labour (IL);**
- (ii) Cities and Territories (CT);**
- (iii) Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC).**

Each RG has specific research programmes, drawing upon medium-term thematic lines of analysis, which reflect their particular scientific identity. Information about the specific scientific identity of each of these groups, as well as about their main goals and achievements, can be found in Point 6 of this report.

Consistency across the three RG's is promoted through Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL) set to boost synergies among the groups, i.e.:

- (i) Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies**
- (ii) Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies**
- (iv) Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies**

Activities taking place at DC-Iscte combine research with service provision to the community, and advanced training (masters and PhD programmes). The research unit is invested in the articulation between teaching and research, according to international higher education standards. It nurtures the transfer of scientific knowledge through seminars, conferences and publications. It also promotes internal debate and collegial co-operation in order to favour theoretical and

methodological cross-fertilization between its different projects, and to foster collective learning and capacity for organizational adaptation and innovation. Its members share the belief that public universities should produce knowledge that may underpin the public debate, namely the debate about public policy design and implementation.

DC-Iscte publishes an online journal, *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios*, and a *Working Paper* series, both peer-reviewed. It also participates in publishing *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* and the journal *Passagens*, in collaboration with the Architecture PhD programme. These activities are supported by a close-knit network of partnerships with other national and international research units, public agencies and civil society players.

DC-Iscte is funded and evaluated by the Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia (FCT), the Portuguese Research Council, having been rated Very Good in the most recent evaluation process.

3. OBJECTIVES' ACCOMPLISHMENT: GENERAL OVERVIEW

3.1. OBJECTIVES ESTABLISHED FOR 2021

The objectives established for 2021 were framed within the global strategy for 2018-2022³ (DINÂMIA'CET-Iscte mid-term Strategic Plan, in the meantime considered the backbone for the funding programme from FCT for 2019-2023)

DC-Iscte strategic goals have been designed based on its legacy of theoretical and empirical research, and accumulated experience of co-operation with other national and international research units, as well as a history of collaboration with public entities and civil society since it was founded.

Generally, major goals defined in its mid-term Strategic Plan (which was submitted to FCT within the framework of the assessment process and funding application for the period of 2018-2022) bind DC-Iscte to research work on cross-cutting and comprehensive topics addressing the key dynamics of contemporary socio-economic and territorial change and the inherent challenges for regulation and governance; to the mobilization of its researchers for innovation in research and communication methods, for intra- and interdisciplinary dialogue, and for strengthened co-operation with their national, foreign and international counterparts in research, as well as to openness to society.

This general strategic framework for the period of 2018-2022 is therefore assumed as the structural background structure for the 2021's activity report and, similarly to the last few years, three complementary layers of objectives were contemplated:

- A. Main scientific objectives pursued by the Unit;
- B. Main mid-term operative goals linked to the Unit's Strategic Plan;
- C. Specific goals for 2021.

A summary of the objectives concerning each of these complementary layers (as they were presented in DC-Iscte Action Plan for 2021) is presented in Table 1.

Activities for cross-cutting work consolidation and collaborative practices among researchers and between research groups:

- Organization and realization of the commemorative conference *Entre Transições: Retrospetivas – Transversalidades – Perspetivas*;
- Setting up the 6th edition of the Workshop D'C-Iscte for Spring 2022;
- Setting up the eBook publication "*Entre Transições*" (early 2022).

Activities to strengthen the relation between research and advanced training:

- Promoting publication among young researchers;
- Support to initiatives and participation of young researchers in scientific events (e.g. conferences, seminars, exhibitions showing work developed by students);
- Organization of seminar cycles in several PhD and Master programmes and presentation of theses' results in unit's seminars;
- Applying for funding initiatives targeted at young researchers (e.g. summer schools);
- Setting up the re-launch of *Passagens* Journal;
- Enhancement of the Working Paper series.

Activities to promote new ways of collecting, producing and disseminating scientific data:

- Setting up the Youth Labour Employment Observatory and the LXHabidata platform in the scope of the Housing Observatory preparation;
- Increase in publications (e.g. indexed peer-reviewed journals, books with international dissemination), increase in the support to dissemination activities;
- Better funding conditions for integrated PhD and non-PhD researchers;
- Reaching broader audiences and overall society, both by improving communication of research results to non-academic audiences and by the active involvement of stakeholders and civil society in the projects' communication design;
- Further development of the CCT journal and its indexation improvement.

Activities for internal human resources management:

- Definition of the conditions, regulations and mechanisms for the hiring of the research-dedicated human resources (grants and contracts);
- Consolidation and strengthening of the technical staff improving specialized professionalization and enhancing skills at the several domains required to a growing research unit;
- Reorganization of the technical staff and tasks.

Activities to assess the Unit's activity:

- Development of a monitoring system for the social and academic impacts of the produced research;
- Improvement of the internal information system for monitoring the research unit's activity, including a comprehensive, updated and user-friendly database with the scientific activities of all members.

Activities for internal communication and Unit's requests:

- Website updates and other communication materials;
- D'C-Iscte Newsletter;
- D'C-Iscte Scientific Report and Action Plan;
- Implementation and dissemination of D'C-Iscte ethical principles.

Activities for Institutional requests:

- Scientific and financial reports to ISCTE central services;
- Scientific and financial reports to FCT;
- Review of the Unit's internal regulation document;
- Sociodigital Lab for Public Policies.

3.2. MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS AND CHALLENGES DURING 2021

The imperative need to adapt academic activity to a new reality under the pandemic contingencies forced a readaptation also in terms of a few objectives outlined for 2021 by DC-Iscte. The long periods of lockdown and the transfer of all academic activities to a digital operationalization model represented, without a doubt, one of the greatest challenges of 2021. Even so, there are several achievements and challenges to be highlighted.

3.2.1. Main scientific objectives

In general, the Action Plan for 2021 and the research unit scientific goals that are inherent to its mission and collective scientific identity were accomplished. This is reflected in the Unit's work across all Research Groups, its Thematic Lines and Integrating Thematic Lines. At this level, a significant consolidation work took place, in order to harness the interdisciplinary identity of DC-Iscte and leverage it in a more robust way, namely:

- To improve inter-knowledge among researchers;
- To promote internal networks of exchange, work and collaboration;
- To strengthen a group identity and interdisciplinary dialogues;
- To deepen interests and commitments around scientific projects, in order to proceed with the strategic planning intended for the unit.

The commemorative Conference "Entre Transições" was an excellent opportunity to produce some tangible results from this internal dialogue, which also included valuable contributions from external discussants and experts on the topics under analysis. In addition to written documents supporting the conference (e.g. policy briefs), a book is being produced to be launched in 2022 that, beyond the texts that substantiated the presentations, gathers other materials resulting from the work developed under the ITLs.

An internal seminar ("Thematic Talks") under the scope of the RG Cities and Territories, launched in October.

Still, there remain a few operative strategic objectives to be achieved through the continuous cross-cutting dialogues, namely in terms of attracting competitive funding for research.

Below some results per RG demonstrating their main achievements are summarized:

- **Innovation and Labour (IL)** – In 2021 the number of projects and funding raised by IL researchers continued to grow with four (4) new projects, adding to the four (4) ongoing projects funded by FCT and two (2) projects with European funding. The Youth Employment Observatory joined this set of projects, since it was launched in October 2021. The number of articles published in journals indexed in WoS and Scopus was larger (25) than that

of 2020 (19), but the number of chapters published in edited books decreased (from 26 to 15). This RG organized two international conferences in 2021 (ECAIR 2021 and ECIE 2021), and the paper presentations at scientific events were 73, similar to the number in 2020. The number of PhD and Master students supervised by senior researchers in IL has remained stable throughout the latest years.

- **Cities and Territories (CT)** – In 2021 seven (7) new research projects were added to the 16 already in progress through various funding sources. Among these new projects, three (3) have national funding via FCT, two (2) have European funding – including an ERC Grant - and the other two are sponsored by national entities. To this set the LXHabidata platform was added, funded by the DC Strategic Plan, and which was finally launched after a few postponements. It is also important to mention the three (3) unfunded research projects in progress under this RG. Equally noteworthy is the coordination of a Cost Action Network (European Cooperation in Science & Technology) in progress. Regarding publications, there was a large increase in the total number (189 publications) compared to the previous year (128), which was also translated into indexed publication: There were thirteen additional articles indexed in WoS and Scopus (35 in 2021/ 22 in 2020). Book chapters similarly improved (41 in 2021, compared to 25 in 2020). Paper presentations in scientific events more than doubled (147 in 2021/ 68 in 2020). In terms of advanced training, four (4) PhD theses were concluded within the scope of this RG, and 83 PhD projects were underway.
- **Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC)** – In 2021, two (2) new research projects were started under this RG, funded by a national and an international entity, adding to the two (2) FCT funded projects already underway. Confirming the same trend as the other research groups, the total number of publications increased compared to the previous year (56 in 2021/ 42 in 2020), including articles indexed in WoS and Scopus (18 in 2021/ 15 in 2020). The number of book chapters was again ten (10). Paper presentations in scientific events (national and international) also increased (34) compared to the previous year (22). In terms of advanced training, five (5) PhD theses were completed and 15 more are in progress.

3.2.2. Main mid-term operative goals linked to the Unit's strategic programme

At this intermediate level, and in line with the Strategic Plan and scientific goals, several achievements should be highlighted, such as the 50 scientific project applications submitted to several funding entities. From this set, 28 proposals were submitted to the FCT call in all scientific domains (20 coordinated by DC-Iscte, 8 in partnership) and two (2) to specific subjects.

Despite the very low approval rate registered in the FCT calls, DC-Iscte achieved two (2) new projects in the general call, and one (1) project on the Covid-19 subject. These achievements are representative of the effort and quality of the work carried out by DC-Iscte researchers. In line also with the need to explore diversification of research funding opportunities, it is important to note that, during 2021, DC-Iscte was involved in 5 submissions to international projects.

It is also important to remark the effort that has been made by many researchers regarding science communication, namely reaching out to wider, non-academic audiences. A growing concern to involve civil society partners in research is also noted in several projects.

Since 2021 was still a difficult pandemic year, several situations implied limitations and required the necessary adaptations, namely:

- The development of research networks and improvement of the Unit's role as a platform for hosting visitors and supporting internationalization initiatives;
- The strengthening of the relations between research and advanced training had to overcome some difficulties arising from the channeling of some activities. Some initiatives were postponed, others took place but under certain contingencies;
- The dissemination of research results in academic events, both national and international also decreased for the same reasons. Even so, there were 254 participations in events by DC-Iscte researchers and 21 events were organized by the Unit.

3.2.3. Specific goals for 2021

Some goals envisaged at this third level, transversal and intrinsic as they are to the pursuit of the Unit's Strategic Plan, have already been mentioned above or are clear in other sections of this report (e.g. Enhancing the functioning of the organizational structure of the Unit and all the reflective and operational work that has been done in this area, as well as the several activities envisaged to boost research – including the increase in the amount of individual financial incentives available to each researcher – which is being reflected in the achieved results). As such, some of the remaining ones should be highlighted in more detail here.

In 2020 it was finally possible to hire the 6th member of the technical staff, thus meeting a need that had been dragging on for some years. However, and due to more competitive salary conditions, it was not possible to retain him and in June 2021 the technical staff of the DC was once again in deficit, and with obvious difficulties in terms of financial management and support for projects, an area that is absolutely strategic for its development.

Regarding the internal organization and its operating rules, the two documents that were under review - the DC-Iscte Regulation and the Researchers' Statutes - were accomplished and approved by the Unit's Scientific Committee. However, the DC Regulation still awaits the necessary approval by the Rectorate of ISCTE.

The Youth Labour Employment Observatory foreseen in the Strategic Plan 2018-2022 was launched in 2021, followed by the LXHabidata platform, around which the constitution of an observatory dedicated to housing issues for the Lisbon Metropolitan Area is also planned.

The process to improve the monitoring system for the academic impacts of the Unit's activity and its researchers was started with the designation of working groups for this purpose and the hiring of a researcher to handle this task as well. However, some bureaucratic processes have dragged on and it has not yet been possible to move forward with this task in the way it was planned.

Another challenge is related to the Unit's information system improvement. Despite the attempts to converge the different information platforms, there are still some difficulties to overcome and to accomplish a comprehensive, updated and user-friendly database about the scientific activities of all members, that can be easily mobilized for monitoring the research unit's activity, and enable analysis and long-term comparisons.

Concerning publications, the CCT Journal (Cities, Communities and Territories) has been evolving in the Scopus indexing system, being referenced in 2021 in the 22nd percentile of CiteScore and in the 2nd quartile for SJR in Urban Studies. These results reflect the growing visibility that the journal has been achieving in the national and international scientific scene. On the other hand, non-indexed publications, such as the Working Paper series, have been decreasing in attractiveness and the conditions to retake the *Passagens* journal remained unfavourable.

The internal meeting on ethics is still awaiting an opportunity to be accomplished, as a complement of the DC-Iscte ethical principles, codified within the framework of the Unit's strategic Plan.

3.2.4. Main strengths and challenges

In a brief overview, the following topics highlight the main strengths emerging from DC-Iscte activities in 2021 and the main challenges to overcome:

- Strong potential for cross-disciplinary and theme-based complementary work;
- Capacity to bring human resources together into a common project as a unit and to respond positively to external inputs;
- Increasing receptivity for cross-cutting approaches and for the involvement of different research groups in collective projects;
- Capacity to attract young researchers with the ability to stimulate group dynamics and to trigger new collective efforts;

- A proven capacity by researchers and technical staff to positively respond to challenges and address difficulties;
- Notwithstanding some evolution in this sense, there is still a need to invest more in the dynamization of the research groups and transversal dialogue within the Unit;
- The system for collecting internal information on researchers needs to be improved, after the stabilization of the recruitment process of a researcher position that will cover these functions;
- The monitoring system on social and scientific impacts needs to be redesigned and relaunched afterwards;
- Space restrictions limits to the provision of new workplaces persist;
- The need to hire a 6th technical staff member has re-emerged;
- The allocation of tasks among technical staff and evaluation processes still needs improvement.

4. DINÂMIA'CET-Iscte Team

4.1. RESEARCHERS (FULL TEAM PER RESEARCH GROUP)

By the end of 2021 DC-Iscte reached a total of 243⁶ members in its research team, distributed among the different categories and RG as follows:

- 113 integrated PhD researchers (IL=26; CT=63; GEC=24);
- 105 integrated researchers without PhD (IL= 12; CT=78; GEC=15);
- 25 collaborators (IL=6; CT=18; GEC=1).



Chart 2. Researchers per category (2019-2021)





Chart 3. Researchers per RG (2019-2021)

Chart 4. Researchers by gender





Chart 5. Researchers per employment link

Chart 6. Integrated PhD Researchers' scientific domain




Chart 7. Overall integrated researchers' scientific domain (initial training)




Chart 8. Integrated researchers without PhD scientific domain (initial training)




Chart 9. Scientific domain of DC collective projects (2019-2021)




Chart 10. Scientific domain of FCT PhD grantees (2019-2021)





Chart 11. Scientific domain of approved DC collective projects (2019-2021)

4.3. TECHNICAL STAFF

By the end of 2021, the Unit's technical staff was once again down to four full-time members (two R&D Project officers; the Unit's secretary, also in charge of support to members and event coordination; a publications officer, with editorial and information management duties); and a part-time website and communications officer. This was due to the exit of one of the members of the team (Rui Raimundo) in the middle of 2021. The recruitment process for a new staff person to replace this position was launched in July 2021 but faced several delays in ISCTE administrative structure, and is expected to be finished only in 2022. Having in consideration the effective needs, as well as the possibility of an hypothetical vacancy in one of the other positions, there is still the expectation of opening one more position in 2022, trying to give answer to one of the most structural challenges that the research unit still has to face in its daily life – the need of a qualified, efficient and satisfied technical staff team.

4.4. GOVERNANCE BODIES

The governance bodies of DC-Iscte in 2021 has suffered a little change in November, with the replacement of subdirector Ana Costa (who assumed the leadership of the board of the national Political Economy Association) by Paulo Tormenta Pinto, who joined the Board of Directors composed by Pedro Costa (director) and Maria Assunção Gato. In accordance with the Internal Regulation amendment proposal, approved by the Scientific Committee in 07/04/2020, the board has been working including the contribution of two additional members, Pierre Guibentif and Ana Rita Cruz.

The Scientific Committee is presided by the director, Pedro Costa, and includes four more members elected by the Scientific Council: Helena Lopes, Nuno Bento, Paula André and Sérgio Lagoa.

All DC-Iscte PhD integrated researchers compose the Scientific Council, totalling 113 members in 2021.

Chart 12. Contracted collective projects per funding source (2017-2021)



Chart 13. Forfeited values per funding nationality and source (2019-2021)



Chart 14. Budget – structure (2019-2021)



A. Dissemination activities

In 2021, 21 events were organized by DC-Iscte, many of them going back to in-person or hybrid formats, which included two major international events: the international conference Grand Projects - Urban Legacies of the late 20th Century, which took place in February, under the coordination of Paulo Tormenta Pinto; and, in June, Optimistic Suburbia 2: Middle-class large housing complexes, an international conference organized under the coordination of Ana Vaz Milheiro.

Table 12 shows that, despite the prolonged pandemic situation, there was a great increase in papers presented by DC-Iscte researchers in scientific events.

B. Publications

Similarly, in 2021 the total number of publications increased substantially, with record numbers of articles in WoS and Scopus. Of course, the steady growth of the DC team and also an improved record of overall results must be taken into account, but Table 13 shows a clear trend that results from a huge effort towards more and better dissemination of research results.

Publications by RG

Chart 15 reveals how articles indexed in WoS and Scopus journals grew on all RG, particularly in CT. Conversely, Chart 16 shows that the positive evolution of publications in books, proceedings and journals is less pronounced. The production of book chapters seems to go along with the articles positive trend, with 2021 figures almost doubling what was registered a few years ago.

Chart 15. Articles in journals indexed in Web of Science/ Scopus per RG (2017-2021)





Chart 16. Books, proceedings and journals – author + editor (2017-2021)

These figures are in line with the productivity rates that can be observed in Table 15, and in which the disproportion of integrated researchers along RG's is also evident. Nevertheless, overall productivity has also improved since 2020 – from 2,3 to 2,9 annual publications per researcher.

C. Citations by RG


The systematisation of information on citations (namely aggregated scores) is an objective to be achieved in the short term, in articulation with the assessment of the scientific impacts of the research carried out in the DC-Iscte. This information will be necessary, both as an internal reference and as an element to be included in the next Unit's evaluation process.

The available information on citations of researchers' publications in different databases (e.g. WoS/clarivate, Scopus, Google Scholar) should be compiled and standardized, in order to build a database that allows for a more reliable

assessment of the impacts of scientific production of DC-Iscte (with time distance, accumulated historically), in terms of academic citations.

For now, is possible to present the figures for the most recent citations (available at CIENCIA-IUL) by research group and year of publication, which reflect large oscillations and does not enable a coherent and serious analysis of the data, as they are too limited for any clear extrapolation in terms of publication impact. A longitudinal analysis of citations may also suggest more definite trends, bearing in mind that indexed publications tend to be more prominent.

Chart 17. Citations per Research Group





D. DC-Iscte publications

Following international and FCT guidelines, DC-Iscte has been progressively increasing its presence in open access domains. CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios (CCT) extended its database listing to the Web of Science's SciELO citation index, adding to Scopus, SciELO, Open Edition, among others. Also, two special issues came out in the Spring and Autumn, adding to the two regular issues including thematic dossiers. All Working Papers are published on the DC-Iscte website and ISCTE Repository and materials resulting from public funding are also uploaded on to this Repository, which is integrated in RCAAP - Repositório Científico de Acesso Aberto de Portugal, or on alternative open access domains, in line with national and European guidelines.


Chart 18 clearly illustrates the significant growth in the number of submitted and published articles in *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios*, as well as the consequent increase in the percentage of rejections, the most significant of which occur during the initial appraisal that precedes the double peer review process ('desk reject').

Chart 18. Submissions, publication and rejections rates at CCT (2020-2021)




Charts 19 and 20 illustrate the growing scope of DC-Iscte publications available through Iscte Repository, in geographical and chronological terms. 2021 records show a steady increase in download figures. International audiences still account for almost two thirds of all downloaded material.

6. Main Scientific Outcomes by Research Group

6.1. Innovation and Labour (IL)

Coordinators: Isabel Salavisa and Fátima Suleman

The general theoretical framework of the IL Research Group is that sustainable growth comprises environmental, economic, social and political dimensions that have to be dealt with in an interrelated manner. The current growth regime is undermining some of its own major pillars, such as the responsible use of natural resources and social cohesion. In our view, mainstream economic theories and conventional approaches have not been able to deal with these two issues and the challenges they put to our societies.

The group is focused on two interdependent domains (Innovation and Labour) and their interconnections.

Regarding Innovation, IL works on the transition to sustainability of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy and food systems, and the decarbonization of economic activities. It also studies the emergence, development and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation and the patterns of spatial diffusion of new low-carbon technologies. The other main topics of research are: the formation and deployment of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs, start-ups and other; the intellectual capital management; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes.

Regarding Labour, IL works on contemporary labour market issues in Portugal and the EU. The research agenda draws on a multidisciplinary approach, combining sociology, political economy, industrial relations, management studies and social psychology, and using qualitative and quantitative methodologies. The agenda addresses issues associated with sources and consequences of stratification and inequality; and with intervention of state and social actors in the labour market. The research topics are: education and skills; work and job quality; telework and working conditions; unequal treatment of categories of workers; youth employment and unemployment; traditional and new vulnerable workers; trade unions and labour market regulation.

Methodological pluralism is a key feature of this Group. It combines qualitative and quantitative approaches; uses innovative data analysis techniques to deal with both approaches (e.g. social network analysis, fsQCA and fuzzy cluster analysis); and makes use of appropriate econometric tools to analyse the datasets. Another key feature is the combination of theoretical work with empirical research, drawing on comparative analysis.

This RG develops its work along two Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 1: Innovation (Inovação) (Coord: Isabel Salavisa)

TL 2: Labour (Trabalho) (Coord: Fátima Suleman)

Main Achievements

It is clear from Table 16 that the number of projects and funding raised by IL researchers has continued to grow, mainly due to projects funded by FCT, that is, projects that fulfil very demanding requisites in terms of scientific quality and innovative contribution. In addition, an effort has been carried out to diversify funding entities, both national and international (European Commission (ERCs, Marie Curie, etc.) and non-European entities (METI/RITE, Japan)). International activity also raised substantially.

The number of articles published in journals indexed in WoS and Scopus (Table 17) continued to grow while other types of publication remained relatively stable. The number of PhD and Master students supervised by senior researchers in IL has also kept stable throughout the latest years.

6.2. Cities and Territories (CT)

Coordinators: Pedro Costa and Teresa Costa Pinto

The deep restructuring processes that affected the organization of socioeconomic and physical systems since the 1970s, and their technological and socio-cultural drivers, raising the centrality of informational, cognitive and symbolic contents to these processes, brought new challenges to the way we conceptualize, empirically analyse, plan and develop public policies to urban and rural territories. The complexity of movements and rationalities behind centripetal and centrifugal dynamics that affect urban systems and the organization of metropolitan spaces today raise also new questionings and challenges to the ways cities are shaped and planned and how academics can develop tools to understand and act in increasingly complex systems, and develop tools to promote their resilience. This research group invests in the disentangling of these processes, through a variety of themes (e.g., the urban form, creative dynamics, ways of inhabiting, recomposition processes, urban representations, among others) and empirical contexts (from the in-depth analysis of Portuguese metropolitan areas and cities, to comparative analysis with European or Lusophone cities, for example), favouring an interdisciplinary perspective.

CT acknowledges the diversity of logics, processes and actors that shape these processes, from a triple perspective, which involves (i) the analysis of the “dynamics” themselves; (ii) the understanding of the regulation and planning issues and the aspects related to urban/territorial action and “policy-making”; and (iii) a “reflexive” consciousness of the way these spaces are being shaped and how they are studied.

This RG develops its work along six Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 1: Creativity, culture and territory (CRIATIVIDADE, ACTIVIDADES CULTURAIS E TERRITÓRIO) (Coord: Pedro Costa)

TL 2: Representations and discourse on architecture and territory (REPRESENTAÇÃO E DISCURSO NA ARQUITECTURA E NO TERRITÓRIO) (Coord: Paulo Tormenta Pinto)

TL 3: Ways of Living, Society and Architectural Culture (MODOS DE HABITAR, SOCIEDADE E CULTURA ARQUITECTÓNICA) (Coord: Ana Vaz Milheiro)

TL 4: Recompositions, metropolitan change and housing (RECOMPOSIÇÕES, MUDANÇAS METROPOLITANAS e HABITAÇÃO) (Coord: Teresa Costa Pinto, Maria Assunção Gato and Sandra Marques Pereira)

TL 5: Territorial governance, spatial planning and socio-spatial intervention (GOVERNAÇÃO TERRITORIAL, ORDENAMENTO DO TERRITÓRIO E INTERVENÇÃO SOCIO-ESPACIAL) (Coord: José Manuel Henriques and Maria Fátima Ferreiro)

TL 6: Urban Morphology and Sustainability (MORFOLOGIA URBANA E SUSTENTABILIDADE) (Coord: Teresa Marat-Mendes)

Main Achievements

In 2021 CT developed its activities along its several thematic lines drawing upon a diversity of collective and individual research projects. These include for the first time the hosting at DC of an ERC Grant (coord. R. Agarez), as well as the participation in several EU projects (- directly or indirectly contracted - Stronger Peripheries, Rurbation, Reshape, Parallel, Impactos COVID) and the coordination of a COST ACTION 18137 - European Middle-Class Mass Housing. These include also several FCT projects (funded through diverse programs – SPLACH, MCMH, ARCHWAR, The Grand Projects, F-Atlas, SIZA, Verão com Ciência) and other society and policy-oriented research for public institutions: (ICA, Oeiras, Envelhecimento Cascais) or other organizations (Impactos Artemrede, Inventário-PS).

Besides several non-funded collaboration in other particularly action-oriented projects, it is also important to highlight the starting of regular activities in the scope of the platform LXHabidata, funded by own (and programmatic FCT) resources. 26 new collective project proposals were also submitted during 2021 to several funding schemes, both nationally and internationally. In parallel to all these projects, the activity of the group is marked by a diversity of individual research projects, also crossing all the 6 thematic lines of the group, including the work of the 9 full-time doctorate researchers than are now hosted in DC with individual projects, as well as the 84 that are conducting their PhD research within this group (including 20 who are directly funded for that with grants that enable their full-time availability).

As result of all these projects it is visible the consistence of the growing in all kinds of outputs, particularly in the publication in international scientific peer-reviewed journals, as well as the consolidation in the activity of the group in several other layers of outputs. Including international presentations, book chapters, other papers and reports, exhibitions, urban interventions, and audio-visual outputs.

Several events were also promoted in the scope of the group activities, including the organization of 3 large international conferences in 2021 (the International Conference Grand Projects - Urban Legacies of the late 20th Century, held online in February 2021, the Conference Optimistic Suburbia 2: Middle-class large housing complexes, held online in June 2021, or the co-organization of the II International Conference of the network “Todas as artes, Todos os nomes”, held in July in Porto).

It is also important to notice that several mechanisms are designed and were put in place to articulate (and foster knowledge crossing) among the multiplicity of individual research projects (particularly in the framework of Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories and Urban Studies PhD programs), including Thematic Lines seminars (or panels/sessions organized in conferences), as well as interchange-dissemination events such as the annual “Colóquio Arquitetura dos Territórios Metropolitanos Contemporâneos” (held in CIUL-CML, drawing upon precedent seminar activities related with this group’s thematic lines) and “Jornadas dos Estudos Urbanos” (held online in 2022), which are fundamental moments for the connection and in deepening of mutual knowledge among CT group researchers.

6.3. Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC)

Coordinators: Ana Costa and Maria Eduarda Gonçalves

GEC centres its research on regulation and governance encompassing the role of the state, of markets and collective action in the context of Europeanization processes in particular. It is assumed that, in addition to the means used by the state through the rule of law and of public policies, new modes of regulation and governance, both public and private, as well as social are increasingly influential underpinned by co-operation and self-regulation. These plural forms are studied, as well as their interferences with fundamental rights and values, promoting or hindering them. Empirical analyses focus on specific domains of policy, namely environmental and public health, digital technologies, financial markets, and social policies.

GEC also provides the framework for research and thinking on science communication and the social responsibility of science, seeking to promote the social reflexivity of DC-ISCTE researchers themselves.

This RG develops its work along two Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 1: Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges (Direitos Humanos, Mercados e Desafios da Governação) (Coord: Ana Costa);

TL 2: Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science (Reflexividade, Comunicação e Responsabilidade Social da Ciência) (Coord: Carolina Henriques, Nuno Dias, Patrícia André, Pierre Guibentif).

Main Achievements

Table 20 indicates that the overall scientific production by GEC researchers has grown in 2021. Individual and collective work by GEC researchers as reflected in their publications has addressed various normative and governance dimensions in specific domains of political economy with an emphasis in the transformative dynamics of semi-peripheral capitalisms, such as Portugal, and of public policy that include environmental policy, digital technologies, industrial policy, financial markets, social policies.

Ongoing research projects, funded by various sources (Compete 2020, EAPN, FCT, Relactis) have been mainly focused on topics of economic and social policy.

GEC also provided the framework for relevant work in the domain of political economy jointly with the PhD in Political Economy and the Portuguese Association for Political Economy. In this realm, it is important to notice the joint collaboration in the organization of events as the *Ciclo de Conversas sobre Economia Política* (Sue Konzelmann, Birkbeck, University of London, 13th May 2021, (<https://www.dinamiacet.iscte-iul.pt/post/seminário-com-sue-konzelmann>), or the Political Economy of the European Peripheries Summer School 2022 - Varieties of Peripheralization (whose preparation started in 2021).

This collaborative work, mainly in the domain of political economy, with a focus on dissemination and the contribution to the clarification of the public debate, extended also to other Research Units. This is the case of the Observatory on Crises and Alternatives (CES-UC) and the event on Iniciativa Planeamento Público e Democrático (O que é planear, hoje, perante a globalização e os riscos sistémicos? Escalas e mudanças estruturais, 27th October 2021). This seminar will also have sessions in 2022, with the participation of GEC researchers.

7. INTEGRATING THEMATIC LINES

To take greater advantage of the interdisciplinarity that characterizes DC-Iscte and to enhance the transversal paths between the three research groups, an internal reflection process and already included in the Unit's Strategic Plan (2019-2023) led to three Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL). ITLs are light structures aiming at stimulating contacts between researchers, between projects, and between Research Groups with a view to the setting up of cross-cutting initiatives, from working sessions to the design of research projects. They are conceived as flexible, likely to be adapted, on the middle run, both to the social demand and to research currently carried out by DC-Iscte. ITLs have no members, only a team of designated facilitators (*dinamizadores*) and a general coordination (M. A. Gato & P. Guibentif). The aim is to link most initiatives of DC-Iscte to one or more ITL.

The three DC-Iscte ITLs are:

Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies

Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies

Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies

A first opportunity to test the accuracy of these lines was a set of Paper Discussion Sessions that took place in November 2018. The results of these sessions served as background material for the preparation of the unit's presentation to the evaluation team at the time of its visit within the framework of the FCT Research Units Evaluation process. The main output of this work appears in the publication *DINÂMIA'CET-IUL – Activities 2013-2018 and Strategy* (2019), p. 76, under the heading "Designing a Concept of Social Change".

A first step of implementation took place in November 2019. Six researchers accepted to participate, as "facilitators" (*dinamizadores*), in the coordination of this device:

According to the guidelines of the unit management, the coordinators and facilitators issued a working plan: the promotion of the ITLs, in particular through adequate information on the DC-Iscte website; and the preparation of the commemorative event that took place in June 2021, celebrating the 10 years as an organic unit of ISCTE, 30 years of DC-Iscte, and 40 years of CET.

Both the papers presented at this conference and the thematic discussions held with the contribution of external invited discussants aimed to reinforce the internal

reflection around the challenges posed by social change in its multiple dimensions. These materials were subsequently further developed to be published as a book, to be launched in the Spring of 2022. An underlying objective of the ITLs as thematic and reflective structures is to enhance future applications to competitive international calls.

8. Social impacts of research in 2021

As established in Strategic Plan, DC-Iscte has created a working group that is currently working on (new) methodologies and processes to study and assess the social impacts of the unit's activity, as well as the reach of its researchers' outputs. In parallel, the hiring of a researcher with the specific task of developing and managing the information system about the activity of the unit (in articulation with Research Groups and research lines coordinators), to occur in 2022, will definitely potentiate and enhance this objective.


While waiting for the results of this working group, and based on information gathered from the annual survey to DC-Iscte researchers, some results can be highlighted as examples.

The social impacts of the research developed in 2021 can be seen on 3 parallel levels (assuming the conceptual grid suggested for this effect in the document "Activities 2013-18 and Strategy" prepared for the last unit's evaluation process, in May 2019):

- A. Dissemination of results
- B. Application of the results
- C. Co-production of knowledge with society

SOCIAL IMPACT OF OUR RESEARCH

THE DISSEMINATION OF KNOWLEDGE AND SOCIAL IMPACTS OF OUR RESEARCH CAN BE SEEN AT 3 PARALLEL LEVELS



A. Dissemination of results

At this level we shall consider:

- **the dissemination of results in the "academic world"**, through publications or participation in conferences and seminars;
(Plenty comprobation of this extensive activity is presented on Appendix 2 of this report), including both the individual publications and presentations by each DC researcher as well as collectively organized events at DC-Iscte or publishing projects by DC-Iscte teams)
- **the dissemination in the society/community**, through more generalist publications (books, handbooks, etc,), via conferences, seminars debates, exhibitions, interventions, documentaries or other outputs, as well as through more or less regular presence in the media or in news, or the publishing of public opinion (e.g. columns in media) or participation in public debates, or even through more institutional initiatives of broad dissemination of science.
[At all these levels there is also quite considerable evidence of the activity of DC-Iscte members on reaching wider audiences than just “the academic world”, which is also presented in the outputs listed in Appendix 2. Besides the participation in multiple seminars, conferences and meetings targeted to non academic-audiences, the regular presence of various DC-Iscte researchers in national media (e.g Ricardo Mamede, Helena Lopes, Alexandra Paio) deserves particular prominence. The institutional participation of DC-Iscte at broad Science-Dissemination events - such as Noite Europeia dos Investigadores - it is also worthy of reference].
- **the dissemination to stakeholders**, through regular partnerships (e.g. observatories), project initiatives incorporating knowledge transfer or co-production of knowledge with stakeholders;
[Among other examples, we highlight the 2 observatory initiatives promoted by DC-Iscte – Observatório do Emprego Jovem and LxHabidata Platform – as well as multiple research projects designed in order to incorporate knowledge transfer or co-production of knowledge with stakeholders – e.g. Stronger Peripheries, Reshape, Envelhecimento Cascais, Grand Projects, etc.]
- **advanced training**, in Phd and Master Programmes, but also in applied, specific training offers (Summer Schools, Workshops, etc...);
[The active involvement of DC-Iscte in 4 PhD Programs – Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories, Urban Studies, Political Economy, Economics – and 10 master Programmes, besides the collaboration (and supervision of thesis) in many other programmes has been the basis for this, but the organization and collaboration in several workshops and summer schools (even if none has been organized in 2021 by DC-Iscte, contrary to the usual) should also be referred].
- **cross-feeding along the scientific community (knowledge accumulation)**, corporized, for instance, in the integration of (young) researchers or in the presence and dynamisation of scientific networks.
[Evidence of this is given through the information presented in section 4.1 – integration of more than 100 non-PhD researchers through training and via

research project teams, section 4.2 – hosting of 10 foreign visiting researchers in 2021 - and appendix 7 – presence in multiple networks and scientific associations. The project Verão com Ciência, for instance, also contributed for the involvement of “new” researchers in existing research activities].

Examples at this level (based on the annual individual survey made to DC-Iscte researchers) are:

Duncan Crowley: work with UrbanA and ECOLISE, with a series of public events, with consortium members, members of wider projects and communities and the public.

Glória Rebelo: author of the Module "Moral Harassment at Work" included in the online training course entitled "Labour Law" organised by the Porto Regional Council of the Portuguese Order of Lawyers

Lidia Fernandes: co-organisation of the public presentation of the results of the study "(Being) an immigrant (and) a woman in the Autonomous Region of the Azores".

Pierre Guibentif: with Hervé Pérard (SIANA), Salima Nial (Evry Townhall), Daniela Piana and Filipe Vilas-Boas (Artist), organization of the round table “Entre découvertes et surveillance: interroger nos expériences du numérique”,

Ricardo Paes Mamede: regular presence in the media and social networks, for dissemination of academic work in the fields of Economics and Public Policy.

Sara Silva Lopes: involvement in Rede-H: National Network of Housing Studies; participation in discussion processes and public consultation of the Recovery and Resilience Plan; involvement as a board member of the Research Fellows Association; involvement as a member of the Women in Architecture Association.

B. Application of the results

At this level we shall consider:

- **public policies design/formulation;**

This is an area in which DC-Iscte has strong tradition, and the activity in 2021 represents no exception. Among other examples, we can highlight projects such as the one for ICA - including a diagnosis of the cinema and audiovisual sector in Portugal as part of the design of a new strategy for the sector, conducted by this public policy institute -, the Strategic Plan for Culture, for Oeiras City Council, or the project Envelhecimento Cascais, aiming to design a strategy and action plan on ageing, old age, and social policies for Cascais municipality.

- **public policies assessment;**

By the same token, public policies assessment is another working area in which DC-Iscte historically has affirmed itself. In 2021, among other examples, a project such as the one developed for ICA - Institute of Cinema and Audiovisual -, which had an important component of assessment of previous the strategic plan 2014-18, can be mentioned again. But many other projects, such as “Contrafactual-ML – Avaliação contrafactual dos apoios às

empresas"; "Mercado da contratação pública de inovação em Portugal"; or "Impactos territoriais da Covid-19 e respostas políticas nas regiões e cidades europeias – Portugal"; are also great illustrations of this.

- **pilot initiatives, prototypes, patents;**

Various projects among DC-Iscte are designed in order to result in the development of pragmatic results – such as pilot initiatives, prototypes or patentes – with immediate social utility. In 2021, some of the results of previously formally finished projects could be still seen in practice - e.g, the 40 pilot-projects of Creative Tourism initiatives developed in the scope of CREATOUR project, enhanced in idealabs promoted by DC-iscte – but also several current projects developed their own prototypes – e.g within trajectory 3 of Reshape project, on the value of arts in social fabric, for instance.

- **cultural/artistic outputs;**

Even if in 2021 one of the recently quite dynamic areas of activity of DC-Iscte - urban interventions in the public space – was not so visible, in the context of the pandemic crisis, there are still some examples of cultural and artistic outputs resulting from DC-Iscte research activity. Besides exhibitions within the scope of research projects, and work with students in the scope of several training programs, it can be highlighted the public opening in the Lousal project, where the participatory artistic process allow the creation of a public artwork – a sculpture - in Lousal village with the local community.

- **direct “work”, such as consultancy, architectural projects, or legal advice.**

Many DC-Iscte researcher have their own applied professional activity in parallel to research – in the fields of architecture/urban project, legal activity, or economics, for instance – in which they have opportunity to apply the knowledge generated by their research on society, and share within DC-iscte community the results of that experience.

Examples at this level based on the annual individual survey made to DC-Iscte researchers are:

Alda Gonçalves: involvement in the monitoring and evaluation of Public Policies of the Social Protection Committee (EU); effective member of the Committee for Inclusion Policies for People with Disabilities (Portugal); effective member of the Technical Group for monitoring the National Strategy for the Inclusion of People with Disabilities, 2021-2025; effective member of MINET - Minimum Income Network, created under the scope of the Social Protection Committee (EU).

Ana Cláudia Valente: management and monitoring of the Qualifica Programme; co-design of Recovery and Resilience Plan (RRP) investments; implementation of RRP investments.

Elisabete Tomaz: participation in the diagnosis of the cinema and audiovisual sector in Portugal and evaluation of the strategic plan 2014-18 of ICA - Institute of Cinema and Audiovisual, including consultation with various strategic agents of the sector and preparation of lines of action

within the scope of public policies; design of measures and initiatives within the scope of strategies for Culture in Oeiras, as part of the application for European Capital of Culture 2027; analysis of policies regarding new workspaces, particularly during the period of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Frederico Pinheiro: work at the Ministry of Infrastructure and Housing.

Gustavo Sugahara: coordination of the project "Ageing Cascais", which aims to develop a study (diagnosis), strategy, and action plan on ageing, old age, and social policies in Cascais.

Nuno Bento: within the scope of the M_CPIInnovP project, production of a scientific article and an online report whose results founded the creation of a department on public procurement of innovation at the National Innovation Agency; invitation to participate in the Sounding Board of the European Commission's Group of Chief Scientific Advisors to assist in the scientific report on "A Systemic Approach to Energy Transition in Europe" that informed the EU's green transition plan.

C. Co-production of knowledge with society

At this level we shall consider:

- **active involvement of stakeholders in research** (panels, workshops, ...);
Most of the research projects and activities held and hosted by DC-iscte have a fundamental concern with the involvement of stakeholders on the research processes, considering at least their participation and involvement in research (listening to them, co-involving in the diagnosis or even in the results achievement, definition of policies and guidelines for action). This can be made within discussion panels, focus groups or workshops with stakeholders, alongside with the project partners, or may assume more ambitious forms of involvement (e.g. Envelhecimento Cascais, Oeiras Cultural Strategic Plan, Grand Projects, Splash, Ruraction, and many others).
- **knowledge testing within communities / co-production with the communities;**
Many projects assume in their design the ambition of a more accurate involvement of the communities in the research, assuming the need of co-production of knowledge with the community and with the local/sectoral stakeholders, or developing the testing of knowledge with the communities. Among many other examples, the work with artists and audiences in the scope of projects such as Parallel, Stronger Peripheries, or Lousal, for instance, enabling creative workshops with partners and artists – or the development of “hosting communities”, is good illustration for this. The development of a toolkit to measure impacts of cultural activities, crossing several research projects at DC-Iscte – Creatour, Reshape, Impactos_artemrede, Artsbank, and Stronger Peripheries – is also an interesting illustration of co-production and testing of knowledge with a.

diversity of communities, at national and European levels, for a specific transversal scientific purpose.

- **active empowerment of communities and stakeholders;**

Many of these projects go further in the involvement of communities and assume as their objective the empowerment of – broader or specific - communities and stakeholders, and direct social change through their activities. They can include mechanisms to empower specific populations envisaged by the project and to nurture their power of social transformation, for specific neighborhoods (e.g, Togetherness, Nutrimovere, Rizoma), or specific populational/professional segments (e.g Stronger Peripheries, Parallel, Reshape).

- **transfer of knowledge in the project design.**

Many projects include mechanisms for knowledge transfer in their own design, be it more conventional - such as sharing sessions, publications, best practices booklets - or more innovative ones - including direct learning mechanisms, documentaries, or co-authored artistic practices, for instance. A project such as Togetherness, developed in the scope of DC-Iscte's contribution to the New European Bauhaus initiative, envisages the mapping of experiences, projects, and co-design processes in Portugal - through an online platform with videos and interviews, or a focused discussion on the future of beautiful, sustainable and inclusive inhabited territories and the path we have to take, together, to get there -, involving the community in 4 neighborhoods and resulting in four animated short films that will be produced, restored and discussed with their co-producers.

Examples at this level based on the annual individual survey made to DC-Iscte researchers) are:

Francesca Sgobbi: New initiative "Università, Sindacato and Imprese al Lavoro" at University of Brescia, where students and trade union representatives work together to analyse plant-level problems and provide solutions that take into account the perception of job quality by employees.

Geraldo Pina: development of the programme "arts in public spaces" (poetry, music and cinema) in Bissau and Sonaco, with young local artists and activists; design and construction of Mediateca Onshore, in Malafo, Guinea-Bissau with Geba Filmes (based in Bissau) and Elsewhere (Berlin).

Isabella Rusconi: team member for the design, planning and implementation of participatory methodologies in various projects.

Laura Sobral: monitoring of the URBiNAT project, supported by H2020, mainly regarding the methodology for local engagement of actors in the Campanhã district, in Porto.

Pedro Costa: within the scope of the ICA - Institute of Cinema and Audiovisual Project, involvement of the agents of the sector in the diagnosis and formulation of the strategy; within the scope of the Strategies for Culture in Oeiras, involvement of the agents of the sector in the diagnosis and formulation of the strategy; within the scope of the Artemrede-Impacts

project, involvement of municipal teams in the evaluation of impacts; within the scope of the Stronger Peripheries project, collaborative work with involvement of the 11 artistic partners of the project and the 4 universities, as well as artists and communities in the project activities; within the RESHAPE project, collaborative work with the involvement of 40 reshapers (artists, producers and cultural managers, institutions) and several partner institutions, in the reflection on the transformation of the European artistic/cultural field and the creation of prototypes for action (artistic and research material co-production); within the Lousal project, participatory process of community art, leading to the creation of a public artwork in Lousal.

Ricardo Venâncio Lopes: work in close articulation with the community(ies) involved, whether they are highly specialized and informed actors (e.g. ICA project - Cinema and Audiovisual Institute) or the population of a specific territory (e.g. work developed in recent years and systematized in the PhD thesis, defended in 2021, involving different methodologies that challenge collaborative work and knowledge co-production processes.




