ABOUT

DINÂMIA'CET - IUL Centre for Socioeconomic and Territorial Studies is an ISCTE-IUL interdisciplinary research unit in social and human sciences, which combines fundamental and applied research on relevant economic, social and cultural topics.

We perform advanced international and comparative research, framed by a sustainable development approach, while pledging to increase knowledge about dynamics and changes of Portuguese society.

We seek to contribute to the understanding of the contemporary world and to the design of the future through the analysis of contexts, actors and consequences of change, encompassing a particular focus on public policy and institutional frameworks, on an analytical and a normative level.

D'C-IUL mobilizes an array of theoretical and methodological resources guided by a common core issue. What is at stake is to capture the nature of the dynamics underlying socioeconomic and territorial change, their genesis in the inter-play between collective public and private actors operating in different domains (e.g. markets, territorial communities, public spaces), as well as their impact, notably in spatial terms (landscape, morphology, etc.).

Researchers at D'C-IUL pay particular attention to individual action (choices, expectations, creative insights, emotions, etc.) and to institutional endeavours stemming from states as well as sub-, inter- and supranational bodies to moderate, boost or restrain such action.

Research focused on the evaluation of the consequences of such institutional regulation is also based on a reflexive analysis of their own domain of activity - scientific research, its relationships with its context and the changes it goes through, in line with D'C-IUL 's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers.

D'C-IUL combines research with service provision to the community, and advanced training (masters and PhD programmes).

Our team shares the belief that public universities should produce knowledge that may underpin the public debate, namely the debate about public policy design and implementation.

The Centre:

- Articulates teaching and research, according to international higher education standards.
- Nurtures the transfer of scientific knowledge through seminars, conferences and publications.
- Promotes internal debate and collegial co-operation in order to favour theoretical and methodological cross-fertilization between its different projects;
- Fosters collective learning and capacity for organizational adaptation and innovation.

ANTECEDENTS AND IMPACT OF THE FINANCIAL AND ECONOMIC CRISIS

A major research endeavour of the D'C-IUL team is to understand **how economic theories exert influence beyond the academic domain**. Several issues related with the 2008 crisis have been studied in this context. The Portuguese (troika) adjustment programme has been analyzed in light of the processes of circulation and appropriation of economic ideas and practices on an international level. Likewise, the evolution of labour markets, firm governance practices and financial systems in the last decades has been shown to be markedly generated by the financialization processes promoted by standard economic theories. This research agenda led to the setting up of a proposal for a doctoral programme in Political Economy involving D'C-IUL and CIES-IUL / ISCTE-IUL, CES/University of Coimbra and CSG and UECE/University of Lisbon.

TERRITORIAL INNOVATION FOR SUSTAINABILITY

Drawing upon the several debates on territorial innovation models that have been shaping the discussions on territorial development dynamics in recent decades, D'C-IUL team participated in international cross-cutting work within the GREMI network revisiting the innovative milieu concept, adapting it to contemporary globalized anchoring processes, and providing more powerful analytical tools **to regional innovation and sustainability research**. Alongside this work, several other European and FCT/PAC funded projects, as well as applied public authorities funded projects, which generated top international publications, have been the grounds for develop and test in diverse empirical contexts new contributions to the understanding of the complexity of the dynamics of territorial innovation and of planning processes as well as the resilience and sustainability of urban and rural territories.

HELPING THE DEVELOPMENT AND EVALUATION OF BETTER PUBLIC POLICIES

D'C-IUL is particularly well placed to collaborate with public authorities in the design and development of public policies, as well as in the assessment of their implementation. That was, once again, one of the main contributions of the research unit in this period, with relevant social impacts on local/regional, national and even international levels. Important work, including the development of new planning and assessment methodologies, has been performed in this period on the fields of **conceptualization, support, monitoring and assessment of public policies**, at different scales and contexts, and on the analysis of governance mechanisms related to them.

REGULATION OF NEW RISKS, FROM PHYSICAL TO IMMATERIAL RISK

Research at D'C-IUL in this domain has contributed innovative thinking to evolving **ICT regulation and their bearings on fundamental human rights from a risk perspective** (case studies on biometrics, security technologies and the big data phenomenon, under EU project Value Isobars, FCT projects PROTECT and S&T risks in the era of social networks, respectively). Overall, this forward-looking research has contributed to D'C's strategic objective to promote understanding of the social impacts of new technologies across diverse fields, from physical, material risk to immaterial risk, and related governance challenges. All said projects involved fruitful interdisciplinary exchanges. All this work produced regular academic workshops and conferences, and encounters with stakeholders, scientific publications in leading international journals, and dissemination through professional and civil society magazines.


POST-COLONIAL PERSPECTIVES ON LUSOPHONE ARCHITECTURE

This research line analyses the way the Portuguese architectural culture unfolded in former colonial territories, based on 3 projects, comparing territories in Portugal, in various African countries and in Macao: inventory, description and analysis of the Colonial Urbanization Office production; analysis of the middle-class residential models that were applied in the construction of the peripheries; analysis of the colonial strategies' influence on the development models practiced nowadays in Angola and Mozambique. The central objective of this research is to **include Portuguese colonial action in the international debate** through comparative studies, and to understand the impact of colonization on contemporary local contexts, as mediated by instruments of Architecture and Urbanism.






EVOLUTION OF RESEARCHERS WITH PHD

INTEGRATED MEMBERS WITHOUT PHD, BY EMPLOYMENT LINK (%)




RESEARCHERS BY CATEGORIES





WITH AN INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH TO SCIENCE


SCIENTIFIC FIELD OF PHD (FOR INTEGRATED PHD MEMBERS)

SCIENTIFIC FIELD OF 1ST GRADUATION (FOR ALL INTEGRATED MEMBERS, WITHOUT PHD)








DISCIPLINARY AREAS OF POST-DOC PROJECTS HOSTED BY D'C-IUL FUNDED BY FCT (2013-18)

COLLABORATION AND NETWORKING

- D'C-IUL is strongly embedded in a **culture of collaboration with external entities** (e.g. in research projects, in the organization of scientific events, in publishing projects) both nationally and internationally.
- Most projects are designed to be submitted in **collaboration with other research units**, and D'C-IUL collaborates regularly with several universities, both in Portugal and internationally.
- Many research projects are designed **to involve partners outside the academic world**, in different roles, and are clearly aimed at the involvement of end users and communities in the co-production of knowledge
- D'C-IUL members are affiliated to **numerous international scientific networks** (in multiple disciplinary fields – e.g. ESA, ISA, RSA, ERSA,), playing a relevant role in terms of organization and dynamization of some of them (e.g. RCSL, ENHR, GREMI, RESER,...). Individually, most researchers integrate the main international associations linked to their research fields, participating regularly in their scientific events.
- Since 2018, **D'C-IUL coordinates a COST network** (COST Action CA18137) on the theme of European Middle Class Mass Housing.
- Apart from strengthening links with the English, French, and German-speaking scientific worlds, D'C-IUL develops the co-operation with researchers of other linguistic areas, in particular of **Portuguese-speaking countries**, covering research fields in which Portugal has specific competitive advantages, mostly in some specific Thematic Lines (e.g. developing common research projects, fostering research networks - such as Todas as Artes, RAIU, PNUM -, or hosting visiting researchers,...).
- On a national level, D'C-IUL researchers are actively engaged in the activities and in the **administration of several scientific networks and socio-professional structures** (e.g. APS research groups, Ordem dos Arquitectos), and had recently a prominent role in the launching of the Political Economy national association (APEcP).





TOTAL DIRECT FUNDING TO RESEARCH ACTIVITY (2013-17) BY SOURCE OF FUNDING AND YEAR









1. INNOVATION AND LABOUR

COORDINATORS: ISABEL SALAVISA | FÁTIMA SULEMAN

Innovation and Labour aims to study two interdependent domains (Innovation and Labour) and their interconnections. We assume that sustainable growth comprises environmental, economic, social and political dimensions that have to be dealt with in an interrelated manner. In our view, the current growth regime is at stake since it is undermining some of its own major pillars, such as the responsible use of resources (namely natural resources) and social cohesion.

Regarding **Innovation**, IL works on the transition to sustainability of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy and food systems. It also studies the emergence, development and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation and the patterns of spatial diffusion of new technologies, namely renewable energy technologies. The other main topics of research are: the formation and deployment of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs, start-ups and other; the intellectual capital management; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes.

Regarding **Labour**, IL works on contemporary labour market issues in Portugal and the EU. The research agenda draws on a multidisciplinary approach, combining sociology, political economy, industrial relations, management studies and social psychology, and using qualitative and quantitative methodologies. The agenda addresses issues associated with sources and consequences of stratification and inequality; and with intervention of state and social actors in the labour market. The research topics are: education and skills; work and job quality; unequal treatment of categories of workers; youth employment and unemployment; traditional and new vulnerable workers; trade unions and labour market regulation.



INNOVATION AND SUSTAINABILITY TRANSITIONS

The work carried out over the last years on innovation and sustainability transitions has represented a pioneer approach to large sociotechnical systems shifts, such as in the case of the energy system, to face the environmental challenge. A new research domain has been opened up, adopting a new theoretical framework, and disseminated by cutting-edge international literature. This work gave rise to original studies, able to influence the formulation of public policy in the area. It has also influenced teaching and supervision activities. The current extension to other domains, such as the food and mobility systems, demonstrates the relevance of the approach, which permits the collaboration of scholars with distinctive academic backgrounds, from economics to sociology and urbanism.

YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND LABOUR MARKET TRANSFORMATION

As to labour, IL has carried out research on the sources and consequences of stratification and inequality in the labour market. It has studied job requirements and the role of education and training in producing skills, wage inequality and unequal treatment of categories of workers (young, graduates, women, migrants), collective action and state intervention with emphasis on trade unions and labour market regulations. It has coordinated a Masters Programme and produced research and expertise on work quality, wage differentials, labour market segmentation, vulnerable workers, the relationship between trade unions and labour market, and implications of institutional change. The research contributes to the debate on the trend towards recommodification of labour and its limits.

THE LABOUR MARKET AND REFORM OF FIRM GOVERNANCE

Innovation and Labour Group is linked to a multidisciplinary research network (economists, lawyers, sociologists and practitioners), in Paris. The network has been working on the transformations of work and the firm in the last decades, incorporating viewpoints from several disciplines. A collective book has been awarded the "Prix du meilleur livre sur le monde du travail", by the French Ministry of Labour. An article published in Le Monde, signed by 91 leading personalities, trade-union leaders and politicians, to promote "codetermination", i.e., a more democratic management of firms (opposed to the shareholder governance model) characterized by a strong presence of employees at the board level and effective work councils. The aim is to mitigate the deterioration of job quality, while safeguarding business efficiency and innovativeness through a dynamics of trust.

THEMATIC LINE

1.1 INNOVATION

COORDINATOR ISABEL SALAVISA

The team members work on topics related to: the creation and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation; the creation of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs and other; the transformation of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy system and the food system in the transition to sustainability; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes. This team also addresses other topics, like intellectual capital management.

Most of the research is supported by empirical analysis, resorting to different quantitative and qualitative techniques - econometrics, case studies and social network analysis – and a large array of data, both primary and secondary.



COORDINATOR FÁTIMA SULEMAN

The team members work in the topics targeting the analysis of the labour market in different perspectives. Some research focuses on theoretical and methodological issues. The goal is to re-examine traditional and new contributions from different disciplines to reflect on recent labour market outcomes. For this purpose, due attention is given to the institutionalist approach and to the need for regulations of economic and social activities. In such a context, the research agenda includes macro and meso levels regulation but also regulations arising from employers.

Most of the research is supported by empirical analysis based on qualitative and quantitative data. Furthermore, the members attempt to reinforce the comparative perspective taking advantage of international datasets available to researchers

THEORETICAL AND EMPIRICAL GOALS






2. CITIES AND TERRITORIES

COORDINATORS: PEDRO COSTA | TERESA COSTA PINTO

Cities and Territories focuses its research on the territorial dimensions of contemporary socioeconomic, environmental and cultural change, analysing complex restructuring mechanisms in the light of their spatiality, their territorial embeddedness and their spatial-morphological dimensions, framing them with a view to promoting multidimensional sustainable development processes.

The deep restructurings which affected the organization of socioeconomic and physical systems since the 1970s, and their technological and socio-cultural drivers, strengthening the informational, cognitive and symbolic dimensions of these processes, brought new challenges to the way we conceptualize, empirically analyse, plan and develop public policies for urban and rural territories. The complexity of movements and rationalities behind centripetal and centrifugal dynamics which affect urban systems and the organization of metropolitan spaces today also raises new challenges addressing the ways cities are shaped and planned, and the ways academics can develop tools to understand and act in increasingly complex systems and help promoting these systems resilience. CT invests in the disentangling of these processes, through a variety of themes (e.g. urban form, creative dynamics, ways of inhabiting, recomposition processes, urban representations; and empirical fields (from the in-depth analysis of Portuguese metropolitan areas and cities, to comparative analysis with European or Lusophone cities), favouring an interdisciplinary perspective.

CT acknowledges the diversity of logics, processes and actors that shape these processes, from a triple perspective, which involves (i) the analysis of the “dynamics” themselves; (ii) the understanding of the regulation and planning issues and the aspects related to urban/territorial action and “policy-making”; and (iii) a “reflexive” consciousness of the way these spaces are being shaped and how they are studied.



FROM TERRITORIAL EMBEDDEDNESS OF CREATIVITY TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF TERRITORIALLY BASED CULTURAL POLICIES

Drawing upon work conducted since 2000 on the territoriality of creative dynamics and on the disentangling of the cultural activities' functioning CT developed a new research domain in Portugal, using a specific theoretical framework articulated with cutting-edge international literature. Research in this field includes applied and policy oriented studies. One outcomes of utmost social relevance is the actual influence on Lisbon's cultural strategy, (developed in 2016-17 by a DC research team, which mobilized the city council and more than 200 cultural agents in an innovative strategic participative planning process), as well as in other municipalities.

URBAN INTERVENTIONS AS TOOLS FOR THE APPROPRIATION AND NEGOTIATION OF PUBLIC SPACE

CT has been exploring and testing the boundaries of public space and the multiple negotiations that occur within it, by the development of specific conceptual tools (Pavoni 2015, several ongoing PhD theses, "Urban Interventions", "Lisbon Street Art & Urban Creativity" and "Art Time Cities"; international conferences, FLANEUR and ARTSBANK projects, several international publications). The link with Architecture PhD and Masters programmes, work with public authorities (e.g., Lisbon Urban Art Gallery, Barreiro city Council), and the close collaboration with international partners (FAU- Sao Paulo, or FLANEUR Project) enhance the novelty of this research, which provides the grounds for practical experimentation and empirical analysis and for observing negotiations of public policy in different contexts, from street art, graffiti and other urban art, to photography or architecture.

LISBON'S METROPOLITAN RECOMPOSITION IN AN ERA OF GLOBAL REAL ESTATE SYSTEM AND URBAN TOURISM

The study of Lisbon's metropolitan sociological recomposition has been one central challenge for CT. During the period under evaluation, Lisbon has undergone deep changes, with a fast process of urban regeneration of the inner-city, which coincided with its sudden integration within the global real estate system and urban tourism. CT has developed several projects analysing these processes and their consequences. The International Conference Lisboa, Que Futuro? (April 2017) offered an outstanding opportunity to discuss the recent changes of Lisbon in light of the experience of other cities such as New York, Vancouver, Barcelona and Milan.

This Thematic Line carries out fundamental and applied research on the role of the arts and culture in fostering development, the competitiveness of territories and urban revitalization from both a historic and contemporary perspective. It seeks to understand the territoriality of these activities and creative dynamics, getting a perception of their organization and spatiality and, on the other hand, it strives to shed light on their multiple contributions to various aspects of sustainable development and the resilience of the territories.

- 1 To develop conceptual and empirical work on the role of cultural activities in the promotion of territorial development and inform territorially based cultural planning;
- 2 To develop conceptual and empirical work in order to understand the role of urban milieus in the development of creativity and cultural activities;
- 3 To develop conceptual and empirical work in the assessment of the multidimensional impacts and effects of cultural activities in terms of sustainable development processes;
- 4 To disentangle the socio-economic functioning of cultural activities, creation processes, audiences, and their relation with the territory (in specific empirical cases: e.g. performing arts, architecture, alternative music; photo festivals);
- 5 To study and put into practice and test urban interventions and art in public spaces;
- 6 To study, conceptually and empirically, and to help the development of creative tourism practices, particularly in low-density areas;
- 7 To further explore the relation between art, heritage, architecture, history and territories;
- 8 To develop the exploration of new methodologies and concepts for artistic urban interventions and to enhance participation-research methodologies.

COORDINATOR JOSÉ MANUEL HENRIQUES AND MARIA DE FÁTIMA FERREIRO





2.6 URBAN MORPHOLOGY AND SUSTAINABILITY

COORDINATOR TERESA MARAT-MENDES

This Thematic Line focuses on the analysis of urban morphology and the operational rationale and structuring of territorial and urban metabolisms, as well as the cross-cutting theme of sustainability. Given the interdisciplinary vocation of the urban metabolism term, this should be used as a concept to bridge perspectives and build collaborations across different strands of research on environment, territory and cities. Both urban and rural realities are assumed as a strategic dynamic and transversal factor for the development of the territories of the future.



COORDINATORS: ANA COSTA | MARIA EDUARDA GONÇALVES

GEC Research Group centres its research on regulation and governance, encompassing the state and public policies, markets and forms of collective action, in the context of Europeanization and globalization.

Presently, new forms of public and private-based regulation are becoming relevant, in addition to the means used by governments to guarantee the rule of law and to promote public policies. GEC addresses both formal modes and processes of regulation, including the legislative procedure, and informal modes of social and economic (market) regulation with special attention to their impact on fundamental human rights. Among the domains under scrutiny are financial markets, Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and social policies.

GEC also provides a framework for research on science communication and public engagement, as well as on the role and social responsibility of science and its actors, including researchers and research institutions, all of them actually increasingly asked to participate in regulatory processes. This is in line with the Centre's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers in order to better serve society. Economics has been especially concerned by this endeavour, but other scientific disciplines of relevance to the Centre – namely architecture and law – started similar lines of work.

Researchers of GEC played a key role in the design of the new PhD Programme in Political Economy, an interdisciplinary PhD, set up in partnership with CES at Coimbra University, CIES-IUL at ISCTE-IUL, CSG and UECE at ISEG-Lisbon University, which starts in 2019-2020.



FROM ECONOMICS AS DISCOURSE TO FINANCIALIZATION

On the basis of FESSUD project (with CES) GEC focuses on the role and impact of the financial system in contemporary societies, specifically on economic performance, income distribution, environmental sustainability, and on regulation of financial systems. The project resulted in five annual international conferences, several workshops, five series of publications (Studies in financial systems, Briefing Notes, Working Paper Series, Research Briefs and Policy Briefs), dozens of journal papers and book chapters, and several books. The OpenEc project is devoted to the analysis of the crisis narratives which have prevailed during the Portuguese “adjustment programme” both in the design of austerity policies and in their public discussion in the media, entailed organizing two seminars which gave rise to an intense debate with and between journalists on their social role while covering the crisis.

SCIENCE COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

In line with the Centre’s strategic objective to provide a framework for research on science communication and public engagement (PE), and on the role and social responsibility of science, the international MORE-PE Project, is investigating the culture of public engagement at academic institutions in different countries. Its innovative character has attracted interest around the world and resulted already in important contributions in international journals, as well as invitations for presentations at international renowned institutions and at conferences (e.g. in China and Brazil). The project is providing evidence on policies and practices of PE around the globe that can be used by research and academic institutions - such as D’C itself - as well as governments and policy makers, to better engage social actors in research and produce research that serves society.

FROM LAW IN ACTION TO CITIZENS’ POWER

Several researchers of GEC tackle domains of the legal system: constitutional law, labour law, environmental law, courts, legislation, etc. Given the relevance of legal categories – in particular human rights – in the debates that permeate the processes of societal change studied by D’C, GEC seeks to strengthen a line of research on law, with special focus on citizens’ attitudes towards the law, providing it with a solid theoretical and methodological toolkit. This toolkit is being developed through active participation in national and international networks. In line with this involvement, D’C researchers played a crucial role in the recent creation of the Sociology of Law and Justice Section of the Portuguese Sociological Association. D’C organized the 2018 meeting of the Research Committee on Sociology of Law of ISA, “Law and Citizenship Beyond the States”(c. 350 participants). Several public seminars with internationally recognized scholars in the socio-legal field have also been held at D’C.

THEMATIC LINE

3.1 HUMAN RIGHTS, MARKETS AND GOVERNANCE CHALLENGES

COORDINATOR ANA COSTA

Under this thematic line, research has focused in particular on the role that the financial system has been playing in contemporary societies, on its impact upon economic performance and income distribution. The regulatory approach towards financial markets was also under scrutiny.

Another, somewhat related stream under the same thematic line, analyses the narratives which have prevailed throughout Portugal's "adjustment programme", both in the design of the austerity policies and in their public discussion in the media. Attention has been paid to the intercourse between the academia and the public sphere as spaces of economic knowledge making, to the extent that the latter engages economists as experts, as well as to the dominance of specific economic ideas and the underlying dynamics.

Regulatory challenges raised by technological progresses in the ICT domain have also provided a key topic for inquiry. Seemingly, big data technologies, the Internet of Things and related developments are bringing about new risks for fundamental human rights that public regulation finds it hard to cope with. On-going research under this thematic line discusses the extent to which the EU data protection reform (in force in 2018), and the novel risk-based approach to data protection are up to this challenge, and lessons that might be drawn from risk regulatory experiences in the environmental risk domain.

Benefitting from research at the confluence of this and other Research Groups of the Centre, in particular "Innovation, Knowledge and Labour", on-going research also addresses the impact of specific public policies, namely industrial and innovation policies, on the structural changes in

the productive fabric, and the transformations of labour law, which have occurred in Portugal particularly during the troika financial bail-out of 2011-2014, looking at the long term consequences of internal devaluation, its drivers and the means to counteract them.

THEORETICAL, EMPIRICAL, AND PRACTICAL GOALS

- 1 To participate in the production of knowledge about the impacts of financialization to the Portuguese economy and society;
- 2 To contribute to the development of theoretical guidelines and concepts for formulating and evaluating regulatory devices of the financial system;
- 3 To shape concepts for debating the impact of economic discourses, in particular, in relation to crisis and its relationship to the support of certain economic policies;
- 4 To provide researchers and political actors with tools appropriate to analyze the impacts of public policies and changes of the institutional architecture;
- 5 To critically analyze how European law and regulation is addressing the risks to human rights arising from digital technologies' applications.

THEMATIC LINE

3.2 REFLEXIVITY, COMMUNICATION, AND SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OF SCIENCE

COORDINATOR PIERRE GUIBENTIF

The TL aims at contributing to the development of training methodologies and scientific practices that understand training itself and research as democratic experiences that include forms of integration and co-creation of innovative knowledge. It also studies, under the heading of public engagement of science, the practices of external scientific communication. Through these two streams of work, the TL intends to help the opening up of spaces for broader debates about current societal evolutions and, in so doing, to rescue the original purpose of the Academia.

One priority topic is the renewal of economic thought, underpinned by the study and updating of economic theory and dialogue with other disciplines, namely economic sociology and law. What is at stake is to foster reflection on the relation between strands of economic thought and analysis, the economic expertise in relation to the design of policies, and the social responsibility of university research. And to tackle this question: would economic science aspire to be neutral?

The preparation of the unit's Strategic Programme was an opportunity for a reflexive analysis of the unit's own current research practice. Within this framework, a survey of the individual research programmes was carried out and, on that basis, the three integrating thematic lines were redesigned. This provided an opportunity to shape concepts crucial for the formulation of the unit scientific aims. The ethical principles of the units were codified. Among those principles, social responsibility of science deserves special emphasis, including the commitment to making research results accessible and usable by institutions and organized stakeholders as well as by individual citizens.

In this reflexive exercise addressing science, the TL takes advantage of the participation of its members in scientific governance bodies, and of the observation of reflexive efforts undertaken by other professions, such as jurists or architects.

THEORETICAL, EMPIRICAL, AND PRACTICAL GOALS

- 1** To participate in the production of knowledge about the scientific world and its relationship to its environment;
- 2** To take advantage in this reflexive exercise of recent developments in social theory;
- 3** To contribute to the development of tools for evaluating the impact of scientific research;
- 4** To shape concepts for debating politics of science;
- 5** To provide individual researchers and research organizations with tools appropriate to analyse the contexts in which they operate, and to define their own line of action;
- 6** Cross-cutting these different objectives: to pay particular attention to the relationship between specialists and non-specialists, as intersecting with other major societal divides.



STRATEGY

2018 - 2022

BROAD OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGY | 2018 - 2022

In line with D'C's commitment to analyse, on an interdisciplinary basis, the dynamics underlying socio-economic and territorial change, its Research Groups (RGs) will focus on:

- The transition of large sociotechnical systems such as Energy and food systems, to face the environmental challenge;
- The combination, in emerging technological and ecological areas, of knowledge and social and moral values to produce creative and desirable solutions for changing societies;
- The transformations at the workplace and the labour inequalities and vulnerabilities; the urban and territorial dynamics and the ways cities are shaped and planned;
- The plural forms of regulation and their interferences with fundamental human rights.

The pillars of D'C activities are the Research Groups, each of them endowed with a strong scientific identity. However, D'C also seeks to take full advantage of the theoretical and methodological correspondences existing between them. Three Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL) were defined in 2013. A survey of the individual working programmes of D'C members carried out in 2017 confirmed the accuracy of this device and allowed to improve its coherence and its adequacy in relation to the Horizon 2020 Programme.

Hence the new formulation of the three integrative lines:

Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies: relating topics such as technological innovation; innovative milieus; experience of environmental, economic and social pressures

Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies: relating topics such as changes in the design and implementation of public policies in times of regional and transnational integration processes; changes in corporate governance and in labour relations in times of financialization and technological revolutions; changes in territorial governance

Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies: relating topics such as forms of inhabiting; forms of appropriation of the public space; mobilization of rights, cultural, technological, scientific and artistic creativity


CONTRIBUTING TO KNOWLEDGE

D'C research programme, carried out within its three RGs, considering its three ITL, will seek to meet mainly the following crosscutting concerns, some of them identified as priorities of the Horizon 2020 Programme:

- 1 To understand the main dynamics governing the fundamental changes in **sustainability transitions**, in particular, in the urban development domain, spatial planning, cities' metabolism, forms of inhabiting, mobility and energetic efficiencies, the transition of the energy system (in particular, renewable energies) and of the food system.
- 2 To understand the **current changes in metropolitan spaces** - in particular in the Lisbon case, challenged by intense recomposition, gentrification and touristification processes - and the social, economic, political, cultural and environmental dynamics behind these changes and the responses to them.
- 3 To understand the drivers of **job creation and job quality** - at the levels of firms and of individuals - with a particular emphasis on the impact of digitalization, the changes of collective bargaining systems in Europe, how the EU countries are addressing the issue of youth unemployment, and how different Vocational Education and Training systems can contribute to different patterns of unemployment, in order to better grasp inclusive and skill enhancing reforms.
- 4 To understand how **European citizens** have been **exercising their political and social rights** in the wake of the economic crisis, and what kind of economic policies and regulative frameworks may mitigate the impact of the financialization process of the past decades, and may support an environmentally and socially sustainable development trajectory.
- 5 To investigate to what extent risk regulation experiences in the environmental and related domains can provide critical backdrop for pondering the limitations as well as the opportunities of **novel risk-based regulatory frameworks aiming at safeguarding intangible values such as privacy**.
- 6 To assess the prospects for new approaches, intertwining research, experimentation and practical implementation, mobilizing innovative multidisciplinary theoretical and methodological frameworks, and gathering researchers, policy makers, practitioners and civil society in **university-industry-public administration-civil society collaborations**.
- 7 To take advantage, in the analysis of current societal dynamics, of the **reflexive survey of the scientific domain itself**, to which D'C, its members and the disciplines they practice, belong; by specific research, as well as by taking the ongoing academic activity as a field for participant observation, while enhancing the validity of this exercise's results by comparison with other domains (e.g. non-academic jobs, journalism, legal professions), and by international comparison.
